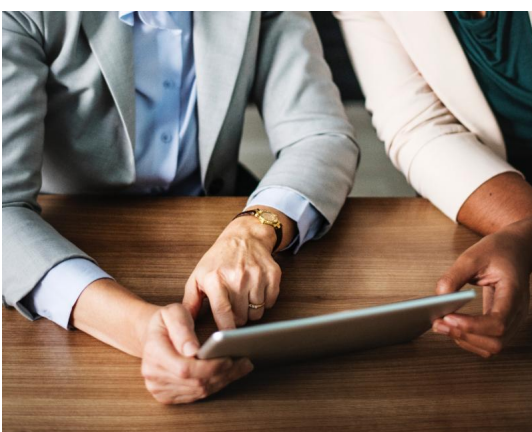

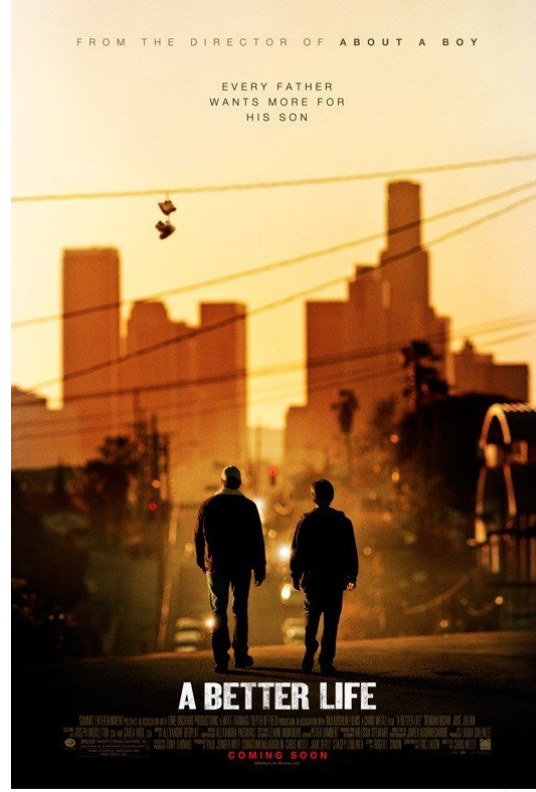

Spring Adult Book Discussion Series: Art Therapy

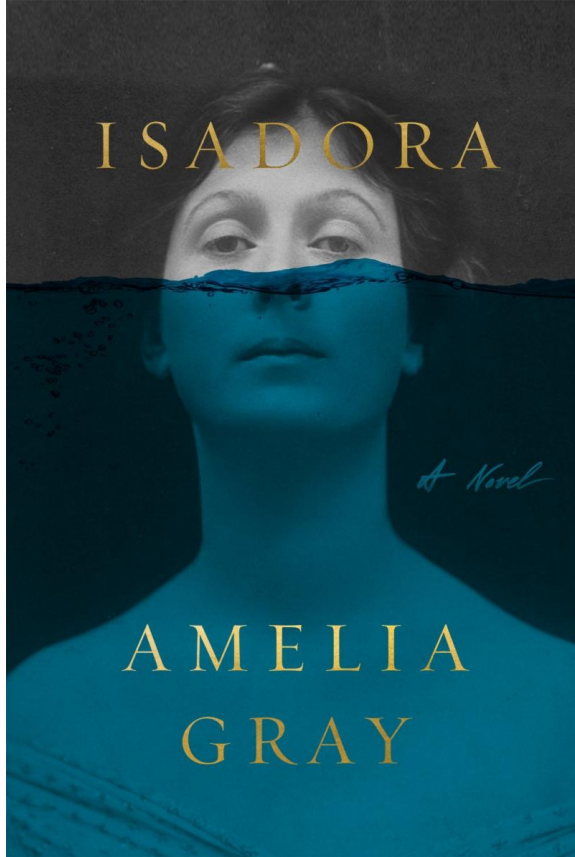

Join the campaign! Our Dungeons and Dragons group for adults will meet every other Thursday from 3:30-7:30 pm. Group size limited to 8 people.

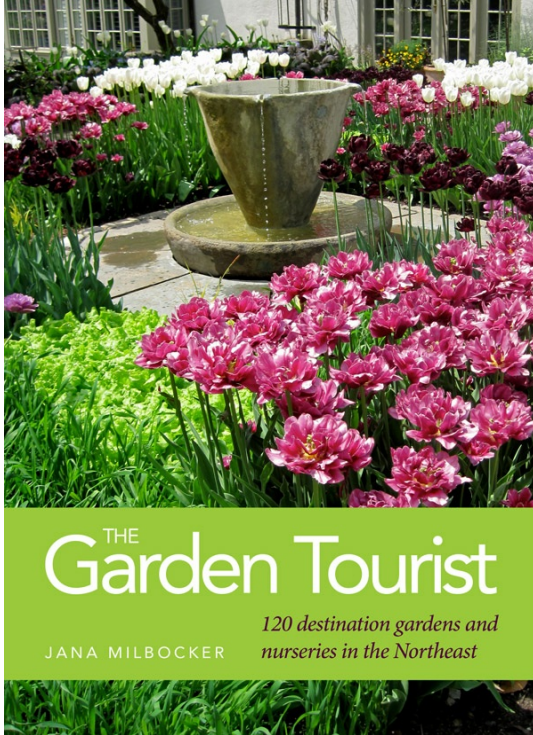
